#### **Worship Service Details:**

Presently, worship services are held on Sundays at 9:30 AM and 5:00 PM. Beginning in January 2026, there will be no regularly scheduled evening services.

# Planning and Structure of the Liturgy/Worship:

Baldwin Street has many active participants involved in the planning and implementation of our traditional worship services. In conjunction with the pastor, our Administrative Assistant, develops a schedule for accompanists, tech people, readers, etc., as well as creates litanies, responsive readings, and/or corporate prayers that support the theme of each week's services. For special services (holidays, observances, commemorations), our Administrative Assistant consults with the pastor, music director, accompanists, and tech people to design meaningful events. Our Worship Committee meets periodically to coordinate all aspects of our services by sharing innovative ideas to help enhance the worship experience.

Worship at Baldwin Street is characterized by the integrated use of spoken word and music. We promote audience participation by means of read alouds, corporate prayer, litanies, or specifically chosen antiphonal music. Our means of worship includes a choir, a men's ensemble, praise teams, and various solo musical performances. We use music in combination with liturgy to create an integrated theme for each service. Instrumentation is blended among organ, grand piano, keyboard, and solo brass instrumentation. We offer our congregants words to the music and litanies on the projection screen as well as in the paper bulletin for each service. Our tech team excels in audio mixing and video transmissions for presentation within the physical sanctuary and by means of livestream online.

Baldwin Street's worship is an outpouring of love in response to what God has done for us. As a community of believers, our corporate worship transforms our individual lives and strengthens our life together.

Baldwin Street strives to exemplify this dedication in our community, both by deepening relationships inside our church and within the Jenison area. We are a spiritual home where all are encouraged and enabled to take the next step along their path to becoming what God has envisioned for them. Baldwin Street seeks to carry out servant leadership following the example of Christ in the way we organize and collaborate on the work of the church—with our pastors, staff, council, and congregation being accountable to one another.

#### Our Strengths/Gifts/Passions as a Church:

Baldwin Street has exemplified compassion and empathy to all who are in need, both locally or globally. We have quickly responded by raising funds or providing needed items for food pantries, Resource Centers, city mission shelters, benevolent support for families experiencing sudden losses of spouses or children, inner-city church congregations in need of repairs or covering heat bills, Between Friends meal support, comfort clothing items for cancer patients, school supplies for needy urban school children, mentoring through the Kids' Hope program, winter coats for children in desperate need, personal care products for those with limited finances, and monetary collections for storm victims, refugees of war, and missionary support. This needs-based generosity is complemented by a strong ethic for regular, consistent budget maintenance; the financial health of Baldwin Street is extremely stable.

The congregation at Baldwin warmly welcomes all visitors, initiates introductions, and encourages return visits. Our guests are invited to enjoy fellowship around our coffee cafe located in our newly redesigned narthex area. This open, well-lighted space is conducive to conversation, communication, and sharing. It is also a quiet place to watch the service live on big screen televisions. For those unable to attend in-person worship, all of our services are livestreamed and available any time on our website.

# **Our Participation in Ecumenical Activities:**

Baldwin Street is an extremely welcoming congregation. We have partnered with other CRC congregations and denominations for joint communal services, community activities (i.e. Memorial Day parades, distribution of tract materials at fairs), and community outreach programs. Our Cadet program flourishes within our Jenison community. Boys from all backgrounds and affiliations are invited and become influenced by the servant hearts of our dedicated Cadet leaders.

## **Challenges in Our Church:**

We have all dealt with social changes and technological advancements in recent years. COVID resulted in a shift away from in-person worship, and we have had to find new ways to get our messages and bring fellowship into people's homes. Baldwin Street also has many members whose age and health cause them to remain home-bound. In an effort to confront these challenges, we have been introduced to new and varied ways of long-distance worship and service transmission. This has forced many of us out of our comfort zones and necessitated some new training and "out of the box" thinking. It has caused many of us to refocus our energies and try some new Internet worthy worship strategies. Maybe in the end, not such a bad situation.

Baldwin Street is a welcoming community where guests are quickly greeted. We care deeply for one another and we do our best to meet each other's needs. We value strong preaching and active participation in worship.
